In this article, the classification of countries by income group is deliberately adopted. We recognize that countries at the same income level may differ in industrial structure and policy trajectories; however, within each income group, industrial structures tend to be more similar compared to those in other income groups. Furthermore, dividing countries by income groups is a common practice in global studies, as this classification is already established and regularly published by organizations such as the World Bank [37]. An alternative approach would be to classify countries by region, but this would undoubtedly yield different results. Classification based on the typology of economic structures would also be more challenging, as no universally accepted or standardized system of this kind currently exists.
